Women, Status and Power in Medieval Society

In 2017 the Annual Conference of the **Society for Medieval Archaeology** will bring together specialists from a range of disciplines to explore the status of women in medieval society, the extent to which they could wield power - personal, administrative, political or ideological - over their own lives, over others and in times of conflict, and how evidence for this might be lost or found in the archaeological record.



The 2017 conference takes place in Lincoln, commemorating the 800th anniversary of the Battle of Lincoln in which the first ever female county sheriff, Nicolaa de la Haye, successfully defended Lincoln Castle to turn the tide of French involvement in the barons' war. Few people have heard of Nicolaa today, or indeed of the many other women who played an important role in the medieval period, so this anniversary seems a timely moment for the society to take a look at the latest research into the role of women in medieval society. Papers from Archaeology, History, Art History and Literature will throw new light on this subject from the 7th century to the 15th.

For those arriving on Friday evening, the Society's **Annual Lecture** will be followed by a wine reception and private view of the **Battles and Dynasties** exhibition, curated by Patrick, Lord Cormack and sponsored by the Society for Medieval Archaeology to mark the 1217 anniversary. 2017 is also the 60th anniversary of the founding of the Society for Medieval Archaeology, and to celebrate this the conference is free to Society members.

The 2017 conference takes place in The Museum, Danes Terrace, Lincoln LN2 1LP, allowing delegates to visit the museum galleries while also close to Lincoln's historic centre including the spectacular medieval cathedral, Norman castle, cobbled Steep Hill with its 12th century houses, the Stonebow city gate and 16th century High Bridge topped with its original timber buildings. The conference venue is an easy 15-minute city-centre walk from the train station with some parking near the venue and other car parks not far away. Complimentary parking can be arranged at the University of Lincoln Brayford campus, a 20-minute walk from the conference venue.
